The list can go on and on, we're human after all. We've heard multiple times that discipline and a strong mindset is how you beat temptations. Well there you go that's it for me, thanks for listening. No, but in all seriousness, while being disciplined and controlling yourself and your cravings is the short answer to combating temptations, incorporating God our father into this battle is far more important, and in today's Gospel, Jesus shows exactly how to do so.
