

## This Monday 17th March, we celebrate the Patron Saint of our Archdiocese, St Patrick.

Who was St Patrick really? Saint Patrick was a 5thcentury missionary credited with bringing Christianity to Ireland. Born in Roman Britain, he was kidnapped by Irish pirates at 16 and spent six years as a slave. After escaping, he returned to Ireland as a missionary. His life is shrouded in legend, including tales of banishing snakes from the island and using the shamrock to explain the Holy Trinity. Despite the myths, his influence on Irish culture and identity is undeniable.
